## PROFILES 101

If you aren't familiar with Profiles, you may be wondering, "What is this Profiles thing I keep hearing about, and why should I be interested?" In short, Profiles Research Networking Software (Profiles RNS) is a networking tool designed to help faculty researchers and clinicians at UAMS more easily connect with each other through common interests, projects, and specialties. An often used, more relatable way of describing Profiles is calling it "Facebook for researchers and clinicians." While this comparison is helpful in describing the basics of what Profiles is, it doesn't accurately cover the usefulness of the networking abilities that Profiles provides.

### DID YOU KNOW, IF YOU ARE A FACULTY MEMBER, YOU ALREADY HAVE A PROFILE?

Each faculty member has a system-generated profile page that includes biographical and contact information; a list of their most recent grant activity; and a list of their PubMed publications. Faculty can also edit their pages to add information such as work within their professional community, awards and honors, teaching and/or clinical activities, and more. There is a lot you can do to really personalize your individual profile page to give readers a great impression of you, your work, and interests.

Included on each person's profile page is a list of their "networks." Networks are formed automatically when researchers share common traits such as co-authoring the same paper or researching the same concepts or topics. A preview of a person's networks is shown on the right side of his or her profile. Viewers can access more information about a person's networks by clicking on the "see all" links within each network short list. There are a number of great networking capabilities that are accessible in the full network view. We won't enumerate them all here, but we do invite you to pull up Profiles and click around.

## HOW DO YOU ACCESS PROFILES?

It's easy; just go to [tri.uams.edu](http://tri.uams.edu) and click on the UAMS Profiles link underneath the center picture. This will take you to the Profiles landing page which houses important information on Profiles (and where this and future issues of the *Plug-In* can be found). To enter the actual system, click on the "start your search" button. This will take you to the main search page. Here you can search Profiles for people and concepts. You can search for your own name to pull up your profile without signing in. Or, you can click on the "view my profile" menu option and login with your UAMS username and password. Most features are accessible without a login, but editing your profile will require you to login.

Those are the Profiles basics. We hope you do visit the site, check out your personal profile, and play around in the system. If you have any questions, you can reach the Profiles Team through our feedback form included on the Help Tab.
